Need a little help paying or reducing your monthly energy bill?

Georgia Power partners with nonprofits, community and faith-based organizations to offer assistance programs to those in need.

Georgia Power's Senior Citizen Discount

Customers over the age of 65 who meet the income requirements for eligibility can receive up to \$24 a month off their bill.



Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP): Available every year from November to May from the Division of Family & Children Services, this program helps low-income households pay for heating and cooling their homes.



Project SHARE: Established in partnership with The Salvation Army, customers can provide assistance to residents in the same community for expenses such as utility bills, housing, food and medical necessities.

Georgia Power's Energy Assessment & Solutions Program (EASP)

The EASP assists income-eligible customers with energy savings through education and free home-efficiency improvements. (It's available through the end of 2019.)
