

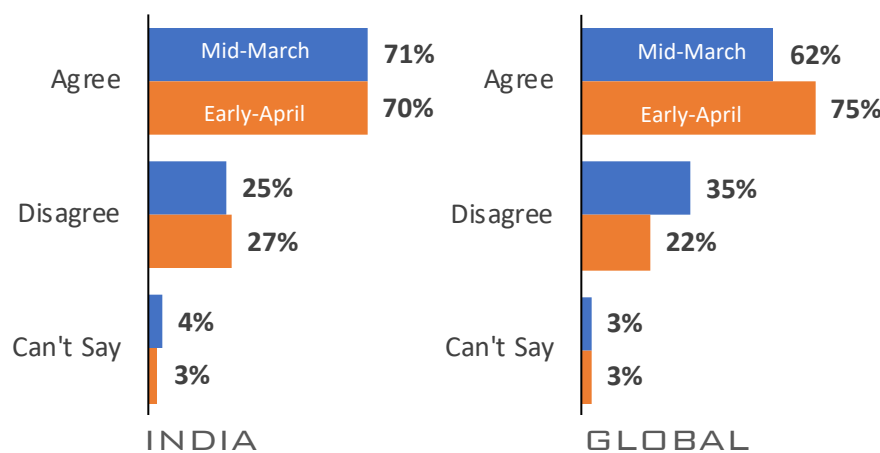

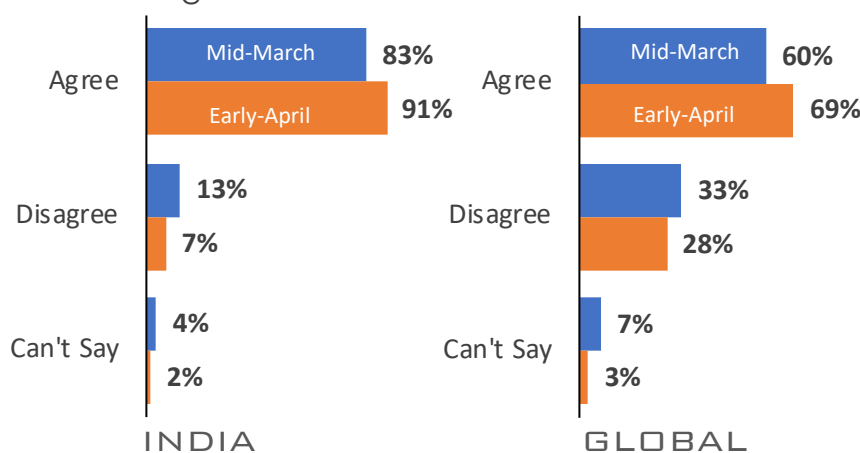
### Fewer Indians are afraid of Corona

70% fear that either myself or someone in my family may actually catch the Coronavirus. People across the world are more scared this month 75% in 18 countries.



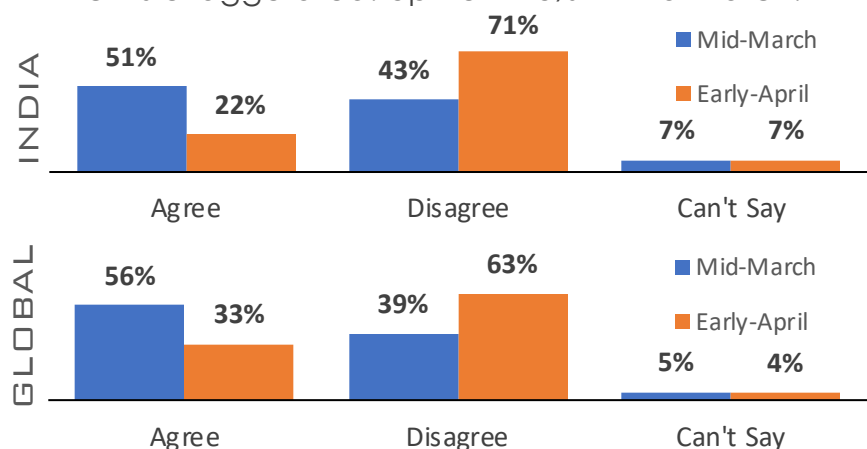
### Growing trust in Govt's measures

91% of people in India think Government is handling the Coronavirus well, that's 8% up in 2 last weeks and an average 20% more citizen's trust in administration



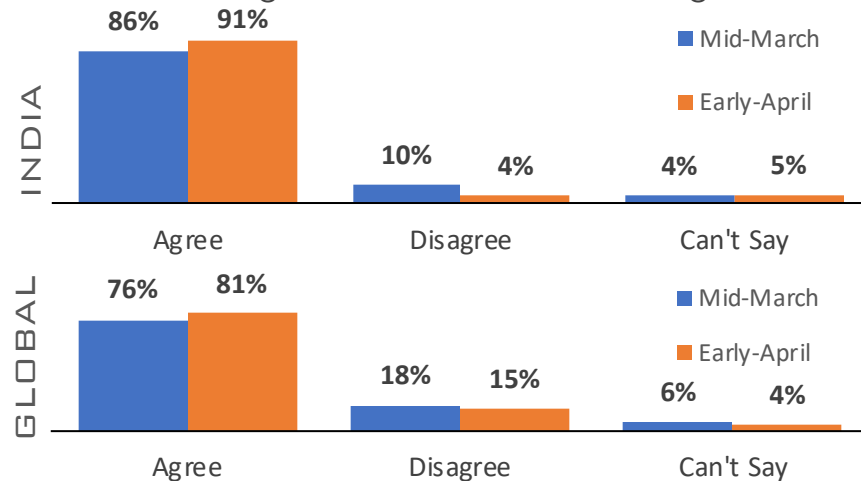
### CoronaVirus is no longer exaggerated

Looking at the leaping curve of COVID-19 infections across the globe, more than 70% of the population believes this is a serious situation and not something which is exaggerated. Up from 43% in mid-March.



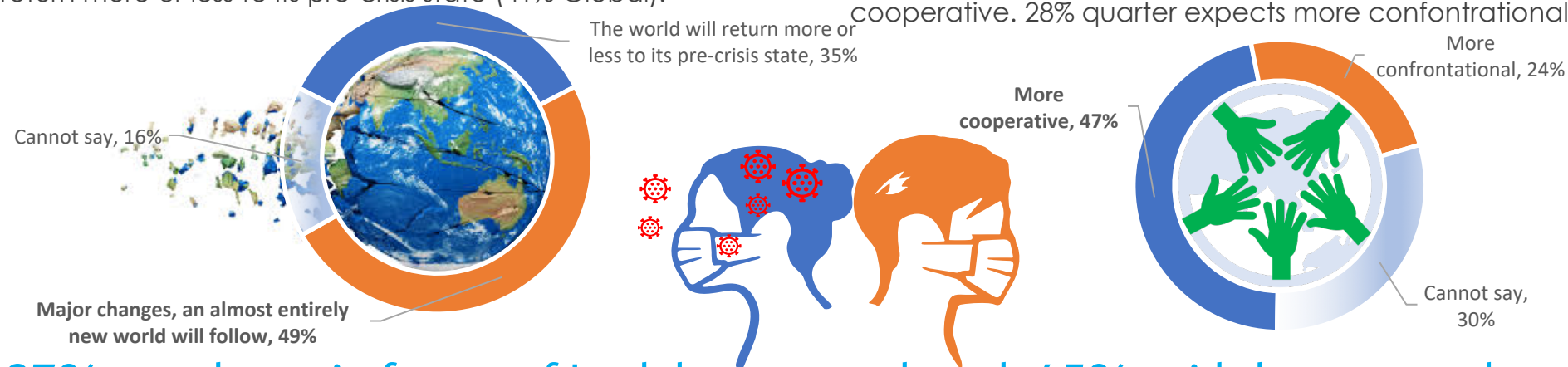
### Ready to Sacrifice Human Rights?

From 86% in March to 91% people now are willing to sacrifice their rights if it helps in preventing Corona virus in India, that's higher than the Global Average of 81%



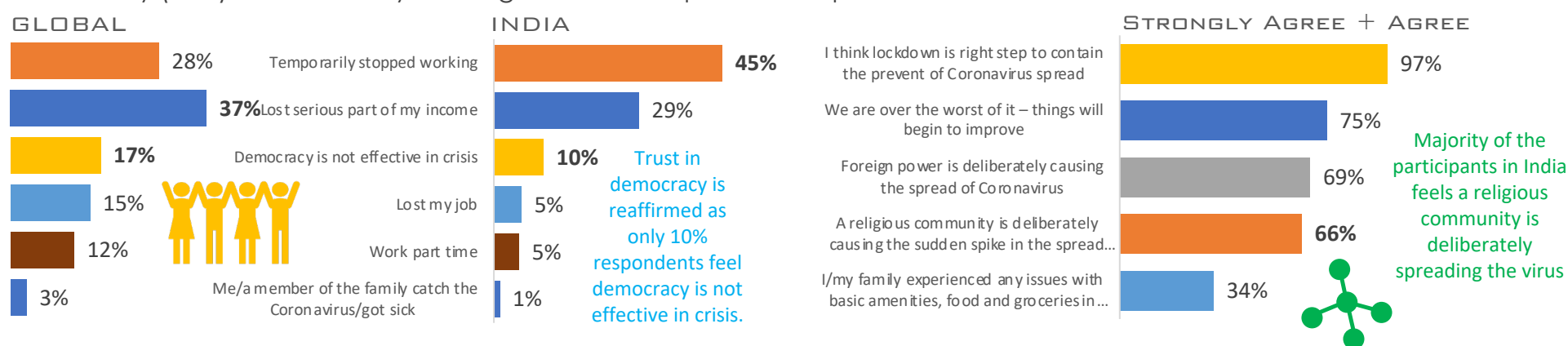
### A whole new world is expected, post crisis. 47% expect Super Powers to be cooperative than confrontational

49% of the participants in India (46% worldwide) expect major changes to follow, an almost entirely new world when the pandemic is over. 35% believe the world will return more or less to its pre-crisis state (41% Global).



### 97% people are in favour of Lockdown even though 45% said they stopped working temporarily. Optimism grows from 60% in March'20 to 75% April'20

Majority of the participants (69%) still believe a foreign power is responsible for this pandemic and that a religious community (66%) is deliberately causing the sudden spike in the spread, in India



#### METHODOLOGY:

This is the result of the second track of the unique Global snap poll held by the world's leading Gallup International Association with exclusive India Partner - Impetus Research in the context of the Covid-19 situation, which involved more than 22,000 people in 26 countries around the world, March 2020 and 17,789 participants in track 2 across 18 major countries. In India, the sample size was 1050 interviewed over Phone/Web/Emails in the 1<sup>st</sup> week of April, 2020. In each country a representative sample of men and women was interviewed via telephone or online. The margin of error for the survey is between +3-5% at 95% confidence level.
