



National Park Foundation Impact FY2015 – FY2023 Fact Sheet

NPF BY THE NUMBERS

- NPF has raised more than \$1.1 billion since the close of FY2014.
- NPF's annual revenue increased by \$138 million - \$46 million to \$184 million – from the close of FY2014 to FY2023.
- NPF more than quintupled its programmatic grants from \$20 million from close of FY2014 to \$114 million in FY2023.
- NPF has provided a total of \$691 million in grants and support to protect parks and connect people to them.
- Authorized federal appropriation has tripled from \$5M annually to \$15M with the passage of the National Park Foundation Reauthorization Act of 2022.
- NPF staff has more than doubled since 2014

THE IMPACT OF NATIONAL PARK FOUNDATION PHILANTHROPY SINCE THE CLOSE OF FY2014

- 19 new national park units have been added with NPF support to the national park system since the close of FY2014.
 - Examples include, Katahdin Woods and Waters National Monument, Pullman National Historical Park, Stonewall National Monument, Camp Nelson National Monument, and Emmett Till and Mamie Till-Mobley National Monument.
- Restored iconic historic monuments including the Lincoln and Jefferson Memorials, Washington Monument, and Belmont-Paul Women's Equality National Monument.
- Acquired Martin Luther King, Jr.'s boyhood home and home where Dr. King and his wife, Coretta Scott King, raised their family and launched the civil rights movement at Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historical Park.
- Connected more than 2 million school children to national park experiences across the country with grants given through the Open Outdoor for Kids program.

- NPF has invested more than \$20 million in Service Corps, supporting 230 Service Corps crews, connecting more than 1,000 young adults of different ages, backgrounds, and abilities to paid opportunities accomplish critical projects in parks and to explore careers with the National Park Service.
- Modernized visitor centers at the Bering Land Bridge National Preserve, Badlands National Park, and Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument, which included stories of the history and culture of Tribal communities.
- NPF completed 67 land projects across 60 national park sites, facilitating the acquisition of more than 30,000 acres of land by the National Park Service, including critical in-holdings at Grand Teton National Park, Yosemite, and Zion National Park.
