THE WORLDSKILLS COMPETITION RETURNS TO FRANCE AFTER NEARLY 30 YEARS

FOR ITS 47TH EDITION, THE WORLDSKILLS COMPETITION, THE LARGEST SKILLS COMPETITION FOR YOUNG PEOPLE UNDER THE AGE OF 23, IS COMING TO LYON IN 2024

The WorldSkills movement was created over 70 years ago, out of a desire to promote skills and expertise. Now, the movement continues to encourage skills and vocational training. Over 85 countries and regions are part of the movement and have come together to promote their national expertise, looking for innovation. This same expertise will enable them to face social and economic challenges, and to bring out the talents of today and tomorrow to meet the needs of industry.

From 10 to 15 September 2024, 1,500 Competitors from 65 countries and regions will compete in 62 skills in front of 250,000 visitors, demonstrating their excellence and know-how.

The WorldSkills Lyon 2024 Organizing Committee, is responsible for delivering the Competition and welcoming the world to this large-scale event. WorldSkills Lyon 2024 is much more than just a Competition. It aims to break down prejudices surrounding vocational training to meet the challenges of industries facing economic tension, and to encourage young people to consider these skills for their future. In addition to being in high demand, those skills are vectors of excellence, professional success, and personal fulfillment.

During the launch of the "Competition Preparation Week" - (CPW), a dedicated time to the logistical coordination with international WorldSkills stakeholders, the WorldSkills Lyon 2024 Organizing Committee organized a dedicated press conference, with the Metropole and the City of Lyon.

A real commitment to youth and education: nearly half of the 250,000 visitors will be students

WorldSkills Lyon 2024 carries the ambition that nothing will ever be the same again for vocational training on the morning of 16 September 2024. On 31 January, the Organizing Committee will announce the launch of an ambitious program called One School One Country. This unique twinning program will allow 65 schools in and around the Metropolis of Lyon to be put in contact with one of the international delegations taking part in the Competition. Schools will be invited to welcome Competitors from the countries and regions taking part in the Competition, on the morning of the Opening Ceremony, for a meeting with the students to share experiences. The children will then have the opportunity to attend WorldSkills Lyon 2024 to see their Competitors in action and support them

In line with the inter-ministerial roadmap supported by the Ministries of Sport and Labor to promote integration in and through sport, WorldSkills Lyon 2024 has announced the launch of the «Sports & Skills» program, which is part of the «Great national Cause 2024». This program has two main objectives: - To mobilize and engage a community of participants in the sports ecosystem, who want to make an impact around WorldSkills Lyon 2024,

- To create a bridge between sports federations and WorldSkills Lyon 2024 to inspire young athletes and re-engage young people unemployed towards professional opportunities.

WorldSkills Lyon 2024 reveals the medals of the future World Skills Champions


WorldSkills Lyon 2024 has unveiled the design of the medals that will be awarded to future WorldSkills Champions. They symbolize French excellence, the city of Lyon, and skills.

Bellecour Square, the largest pedestrian square in Europe, is one of the first key elements of this medal. It represents the starting point, where everything begins, as for the beginning of a brilliant and meaningful career. The six sides of the hexagon represent both France and the six sectors making up the Competition. The 62 skills represented are symbolized by a dot in relief.
