#### A FAMILY LEGACY OF AVIATION EXCELLENCE

It all started with a double passion for aviation.

Twin brothers Ronnie and Donnie began taking flying lessons at the local Kirsch Municipal Airport (KIRS) in Sturgis, Michigan, more than 30 years ago. Ronnie's children Brian, David and Becky watched as their father's love of aviation and his new hobby grew, supported by their day job...Riley Construction Company.

All the kids helped in the business, even pouring cement for sidewalks and driveways after school. But when the retiring airport manager presented the brothers with the opportunity to take over KIRS, they won the bid and quickly traded in their backhoe for an airplane. They founded Riley Aviation in 1982, opening their office with two twin desks that faced each other.

#### Riley Aviation Inc: The Dream Come True

The company was originally the airport manager for the City of Sturgis and a flight school. The entire family, including mom, Kay, worked in the business. The kids took care of the planes, manned the office, and ran the rental car desk. Kay handled administration and accounting.

As for aviation, Brian, David, and Becky all learned to fly. The boys each earned their pilot's license at age 16. Brian, however, was the biggest aviation enthusiast in the family. His bedroom was filled with model planes and he could identify any airplane on sight.

After graduation, Brian joined the U.S. Army and was one of the few students directly accepted from high school into helicopter flight school. He flew a UH1 (Huey) helicopter out of Fort Hood, Texas. For Brian, this was the culmination of a childhood dream that started when Ronnie, a former Army helicopter crew chief, first introduced him to helicopter flight.

Meanwhile, David attended Western Michigan University for aviation while managing KIRS. Becky went to college in 1990 and graduated from the University of Mississippi with a degree in business management. After six years in the Army, Brian returned to help with the family business.

Sadly, Ronald Riley died in 1990, shortly after Brian's return. His death ushered in a new era for the business, one that Brian, David, and Becky were ready to face. Then the family suffered the loss of its other patriarch, Donnie, who died in 2005 and the company passed 100% into the hands of Brian, David, and Becky.

It was also about that time that the economy took an ominous toll on the entire aviation industry, including RAI Jets.

#### RAI Jets: A New Brand for a New Era

With the economic downturn, fewer people were learning to fly or book charter flights. The market was changing, and the trio knew they would have to make significant changes if Riley Aviation was to survive.

Together, they envisioned a new company that would focus on three things: aircraft management, maintenance, and charter service. As a Part 135 Operator, the company could give people a faster, more luxurious option for travel and help owners maintain and manage their jets. When not in use, jet owners would even be able to offset their operating costs by permitting RAI Jets to charter their aircraft on their Air Carrier Certificate.



The new company was called RAI Jets and officially opened its doors in 2009. With the "Life of Riley" Jet Card program to boost air charter sales and the development of a turnkey aircraft management program, RAI Jets was off and running.

Today the company retains its original location at KIRS, where it all started. But in 2016, RAI Jets welcomed its new location at the Kalamazoo/Battle Creek International Airport. Both offices offer hangar space and charter flights with maintenance and overall operations as well as the RAI fleet of aircraft managed from the KAZO location.

All three of the original owners are still active in the company, as well as their mother, Kay and Brian's daughter, Christina, who once had a crib in her father's office. The twin desks of the founders still remain at KIRS and are used by those they loved. Meanwhile, RAI Jets is powered by a family with strong tradition, passion for aviation and dedication to treating each customer like a member of their own family.

their aircraft to RAI Jets' FAA Air Charter Certificate. RAI Jets then charters flights on the aircraft when it is not in use by the owner.

RAI Jets is a family-owned company that has seen steady growth since its founding in 2009. However, the managing Riley family has a thirty-year old aviation history that began as Riley Aviation at Kirsch Municipal Airport (KIRS). Riley Aviation operated as a flight school in the early eighties and entered the Part 135 jet air charter business in 1990. RAI Jets opened their 30,000 square-foot hangar at KAZO in 2016. Last year, RAI Service Center, a designated Part 145 Repair Station, was opened at KAZO as well. RAI Jets also has plans to build an additional hangar on their property by the end of 2023.

The Challenger 601 is known as one of the most popular heavy business jets on the market because of its spacious cabin and headroom and fuel efficiency for its size. The aircraft is a 13seater although it will be flown with nine passengers by the Part 135 company. Currently, RAI Jets is providing the heavy jet management, which includes the aircraft's maintenance, crew, and hangar space in addition to supplying fuel from RAI Jets' own fuel farm.
