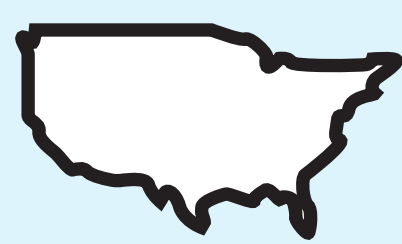

Interactions, Trust and Respect



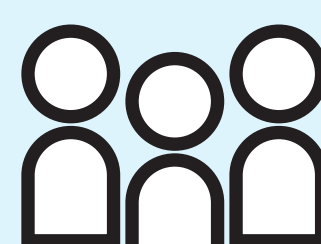
When asked about interactions with police **NATIONWIDE**

only **12%**

said they were getting **BETTER**

50%

said they were getting **WORSE**



When asked about interactions with police in their own **COMMUNITY**

19% said they were getting **BETTER**

56% said they were about the **SAME**

19% said they were getting **WORSE**

Different opinions among **DIFFERENT RACIAL GROUPS** on interactions getting worse:

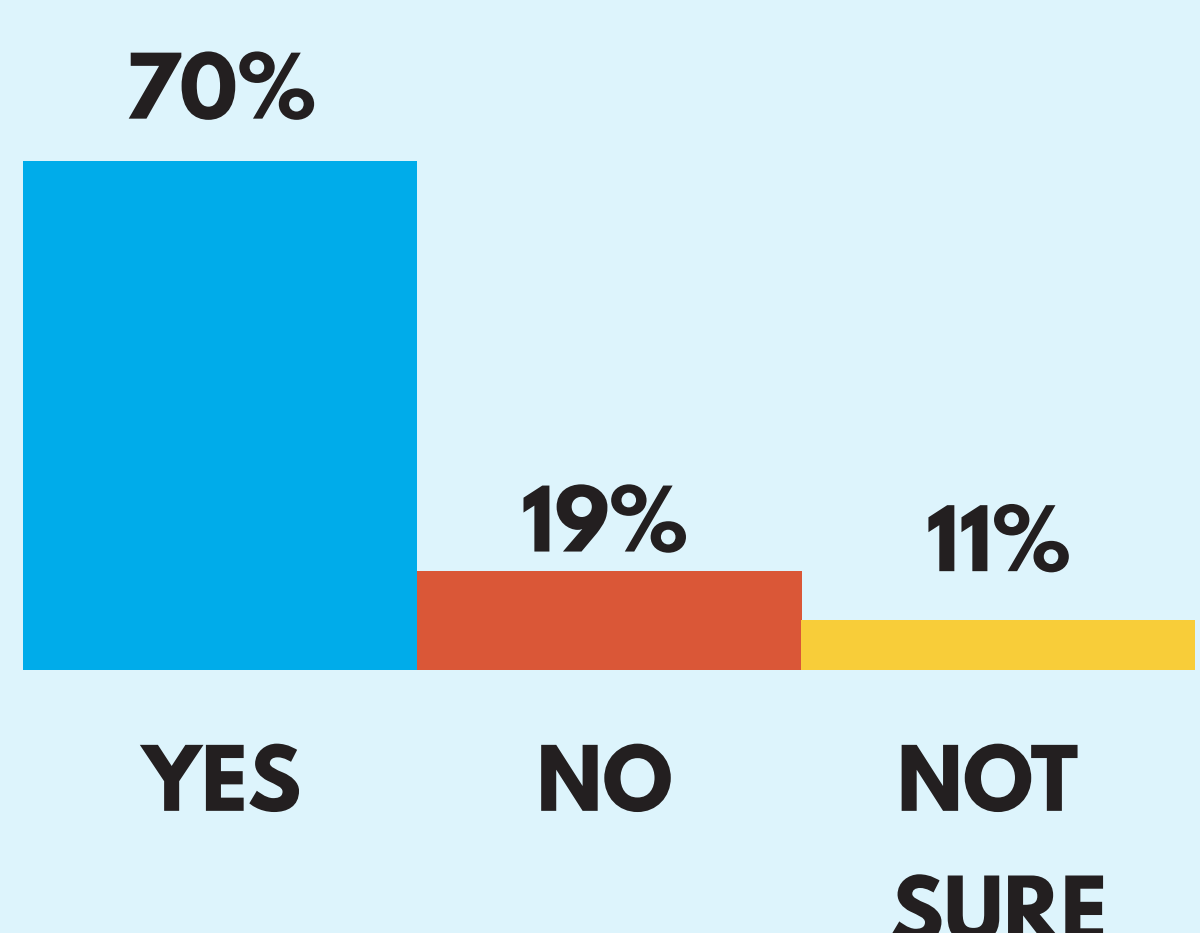
13% **WHITE**

27% **HISPANIC**

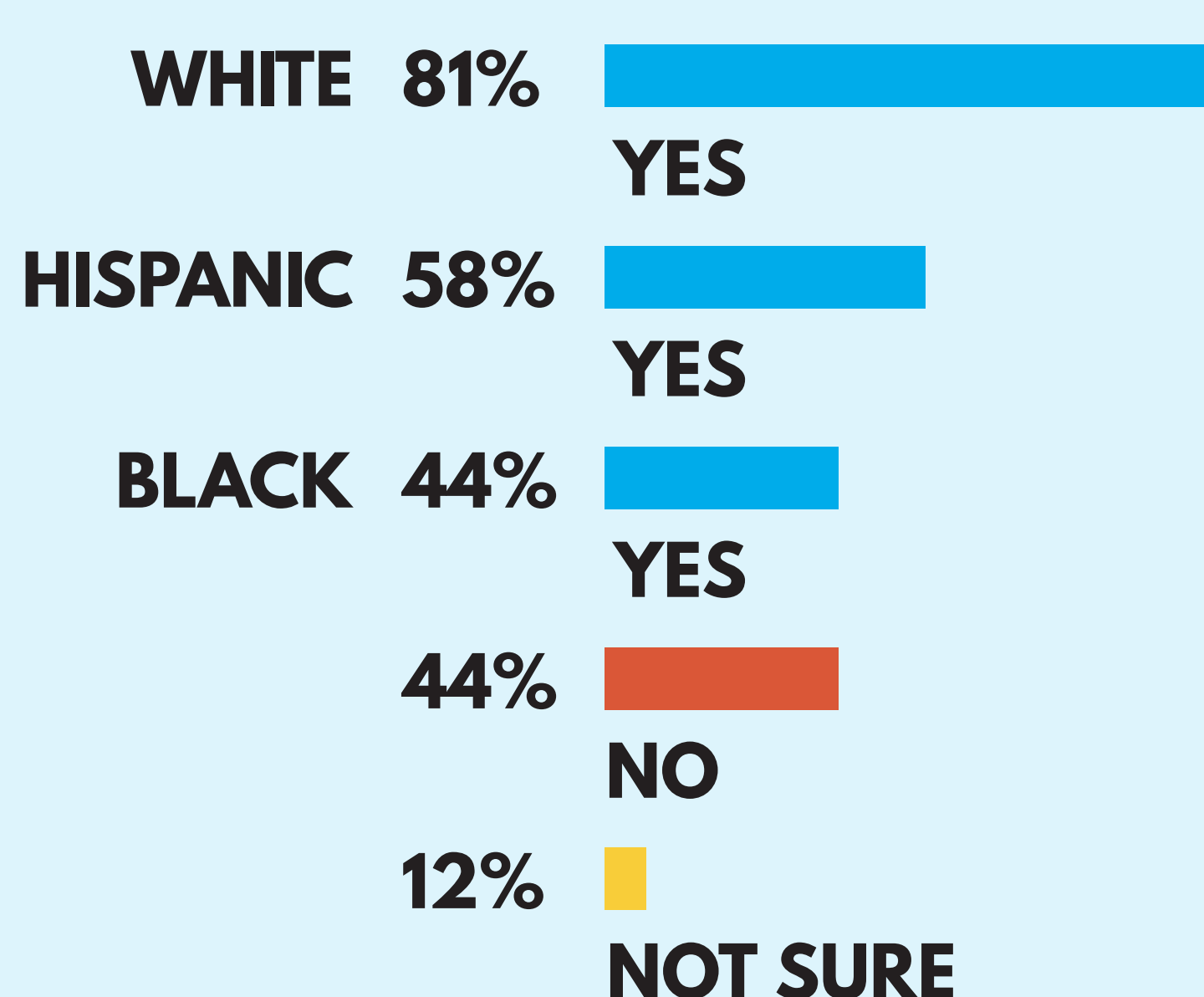
36% **BLACK**



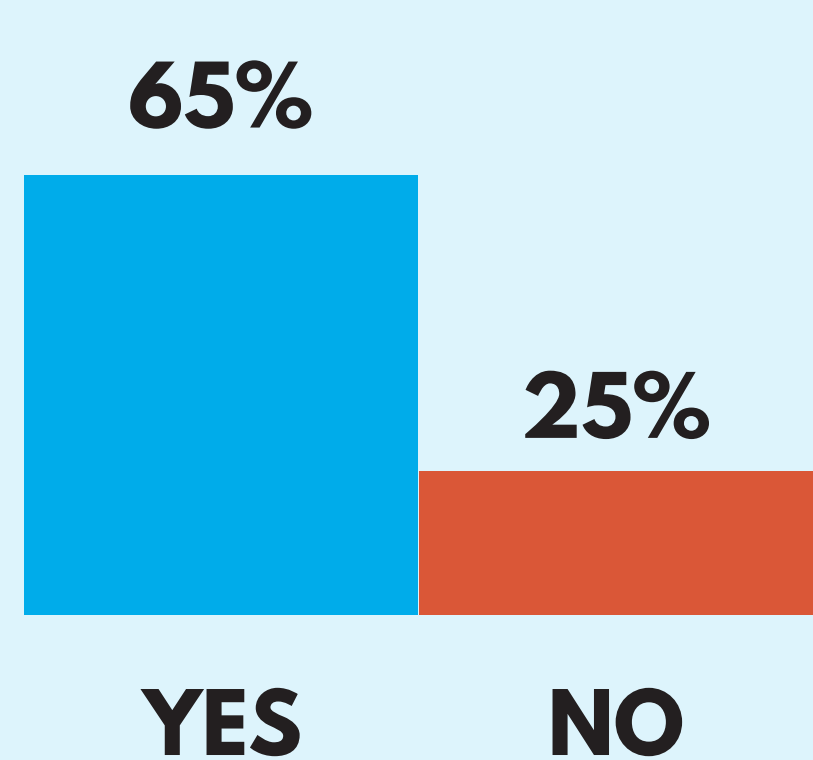
When asked if police are **RESPECTFUL OF CITIZENS' RIGHTS**



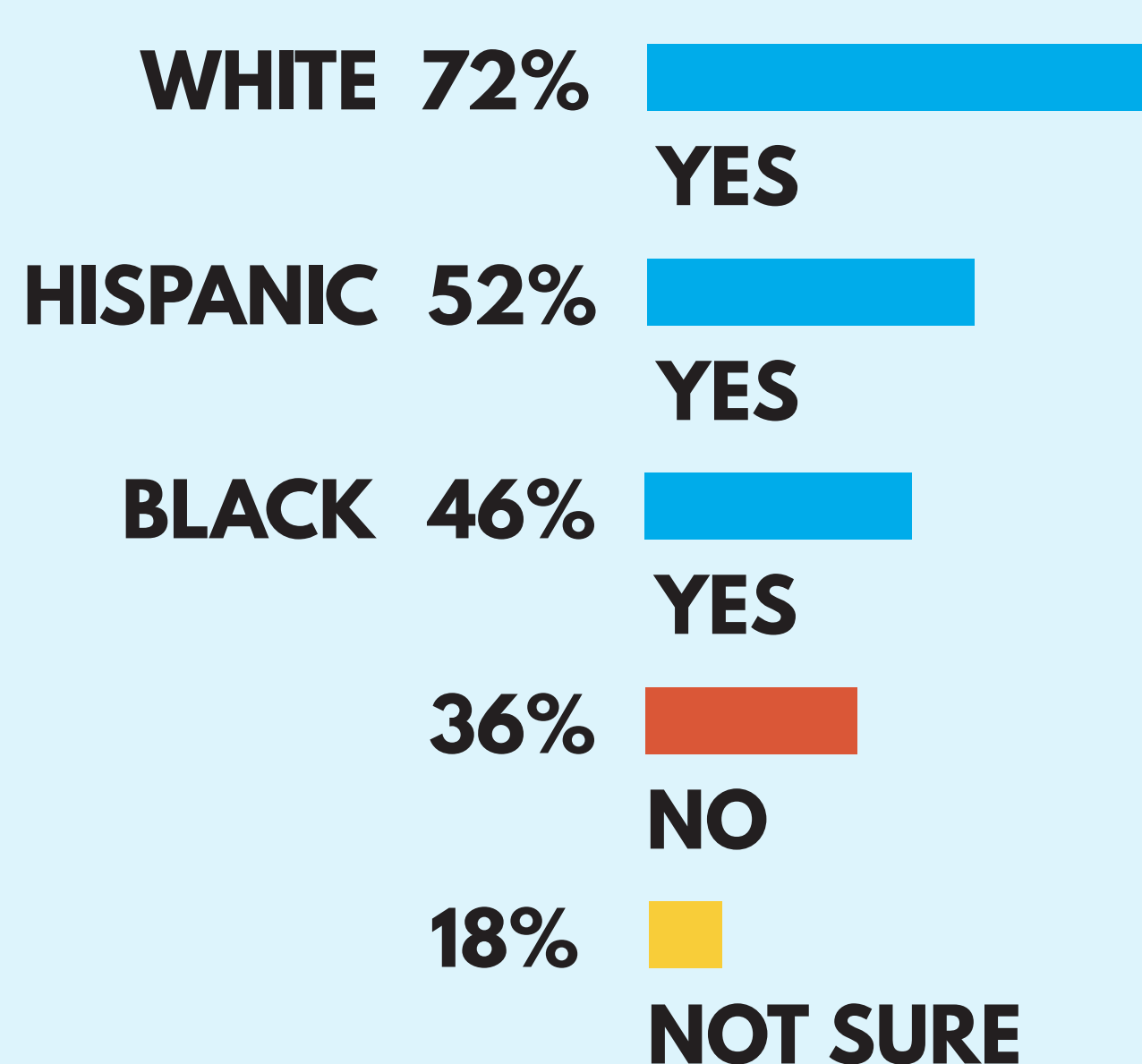
Different opinions among **DIFFERENT RACIAL GROUPS**



On the flip side, when asked if **CITIZENS** were respectful of police in their community



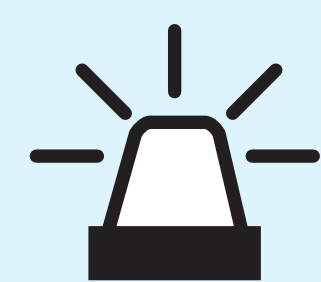
Different opinions among **DIFFERENT RACIAL GROUPS**



Improving Police and Community Relations for Public Safety

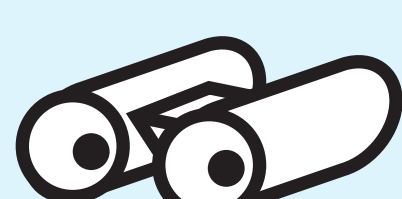


69% felt the public should have **INPUT IN THE CREATION** of police rules and policies.

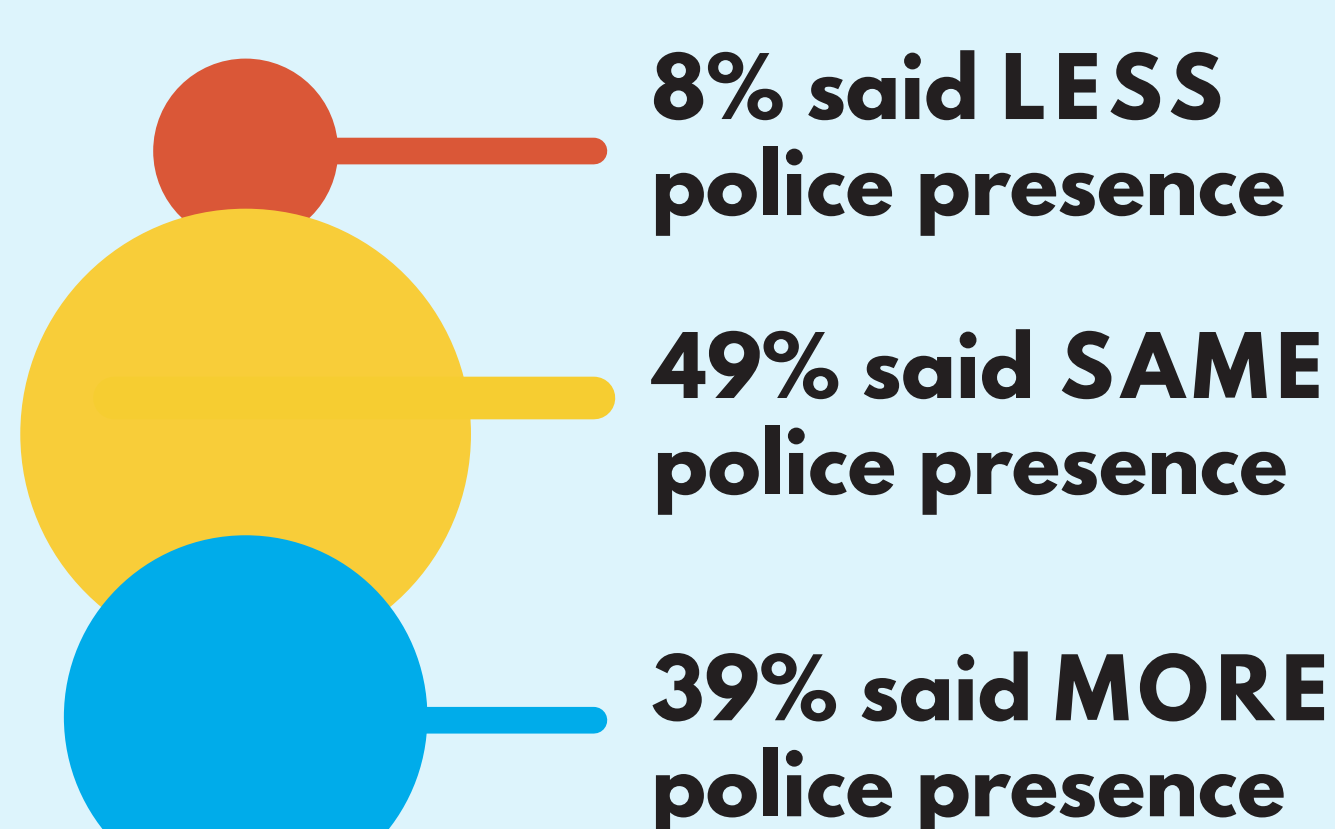


When asked about **ROLE OF THE POLICE** to prevent crime

70% want constant presence in the community to prevent crime
22% want responding to crime when it happens



When asked about police **PRESENCE IN THEIR COMMUNITY**, people would like to see



34% of **BLACK** respondents would like to see **MORE** police present in their community. Only 14% of **BLACK** respondents would like to see **LESS** police present in their community.

34% said **MORE**
14% said **LESS**
