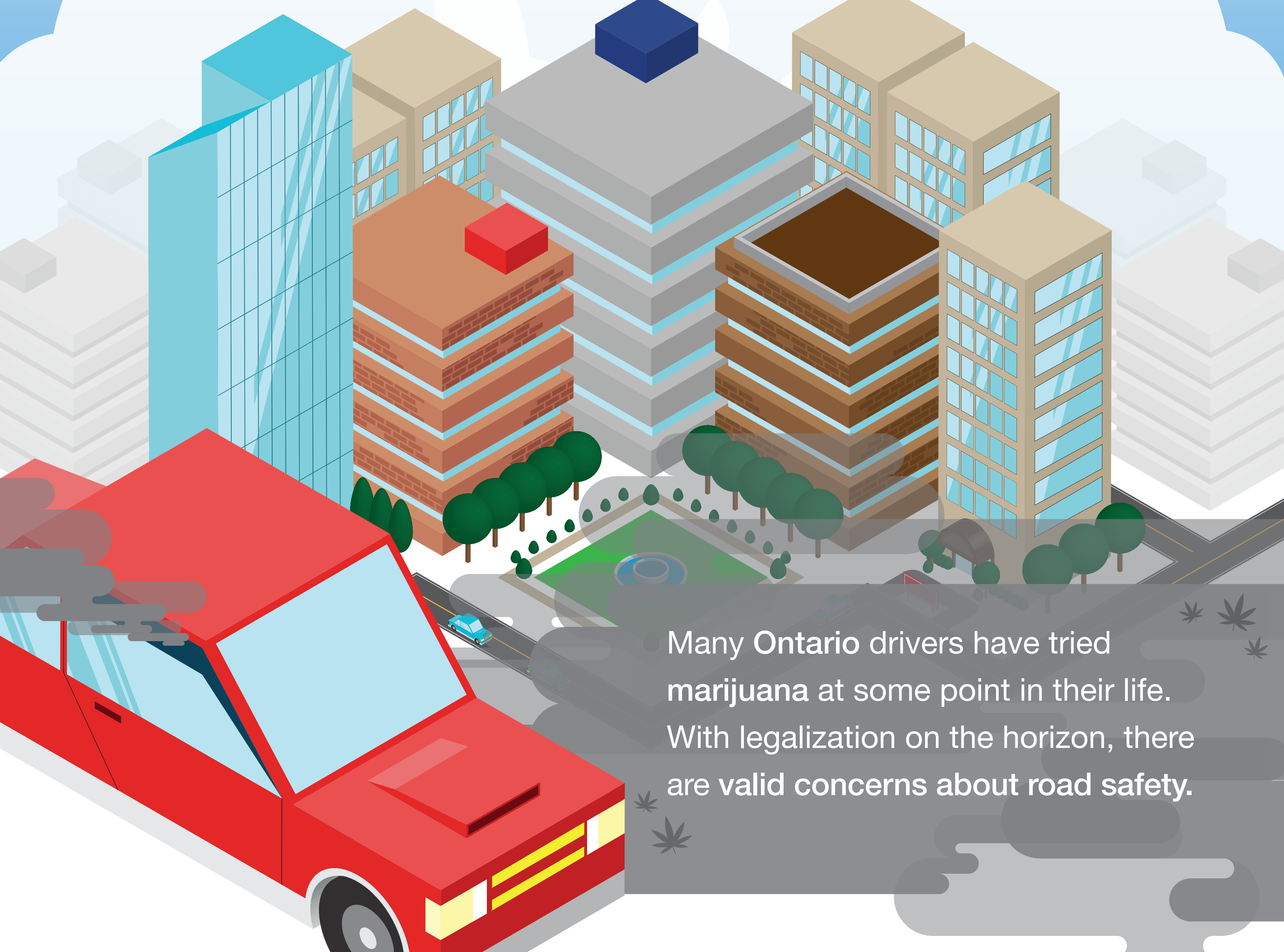




# Know the facts about Drug-impaired driving.

Marijuana users are more likely to be between the ages of 19 and 44.

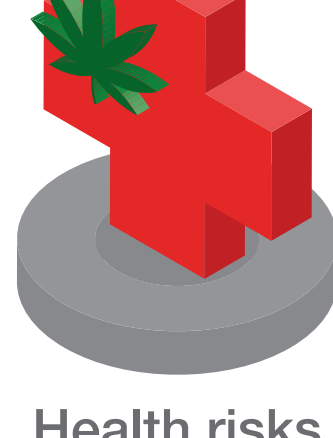


Marijuana users are more likely to hold a G licence.

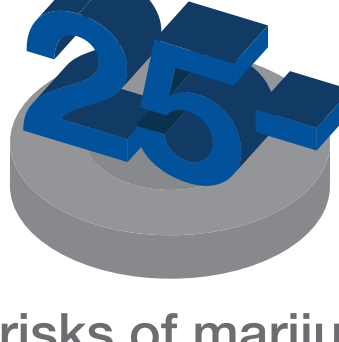

## Marijuana-impaired driving.

**1.4 million**

Ontario drivers drove under the influence of marijuana

**Over 485,000**

Ontario drivers drove while under marijuana influence in the past 3 months

**2 in 10**

Current users drove under the influence in the past 3 months

Current marijuana users are defined as those who used in the past 3 months

Road safety **concerns** following legalization.

**77%** concerned about road safety following legalization of marijuana

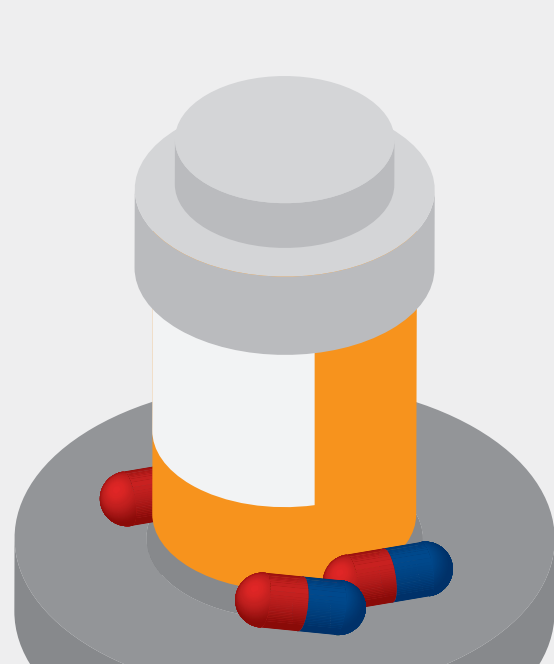
Public perception of **Marijuana-impaired driving.**

**72%** consider that marijuana impaired drivers drive worse than a sober driver

**17%** consider that marijuana impaired drivers drive the same or better than a sober driver
