



Know the facts about **Drug-impaired driving.**

Marijuana-impaired driving.

1.4 million

Ontario drivers drove under the influence of marijuana

Over 485,000

Ontario drivers drove while under marijuana influence in the past 3 months

2 in 10

Current users drove under the influence in the past 3 months

Current marijuana users are defined as those who used in the past 3 months

Road safety **concerns** following legalization.

77%

Public perception of Marijuana-impaired driving.

72%

consider that marijuana impaired drivers drive worse than a sober driver consider that marijuana impaired drivers drive the same or better than a sober driver
